We have three long-haired miniature dachshunds, Mickey, Mario, and Maybe, all from the same litter. They're senior citizens now, having just celebrated their 14<sup>th</sup> birthday in June.

Beginning a few years ago, we saw that our "babies" were developing cataracts or lenticular sclerosis. We were resigned to having to pay for expensive surgery, times three, to assure their quality of life. You see, there is a floor to ceiling window in the living room, and the three of them live for sitting there, waiting for any sign of movement outside. As their sight began to fail, we noticed they were spending less and less time patrolling their "post", and instead were taking longer and longer naps. The squirrels were frolicking outside the front window, no longer in fear for their lives.

Almost a year ago, we heard about OcluVet from Dr. Nancy Decker, a holistic vet that just moved in to our area. We began a program with each of our pups, drops three times a day for two months. By the end of the two months, their eyes were definitely less opaque, and they were back patrolling their territory.

We continued giving them drops, first once per day, then three times per week for maintenance. It was expensive, but it was certainly a lot less than surgery! And it was a lot less traumatic for them, and for us.
