Sorry for the delay in getting back with you! OcluVet/Health Care Resource Services in Washington Crossing, Pennsylvania, did not provide me a slit lamp nor a digital ophthalmic camera to accurately score the lens changes of the dogs in my clinical trial study. OcluVet-TM which is a L-Carnosine and N-Acetylcarnosine nutritional eye drop formula was to be used one drop three times daily for 50 days. I made evaluations at least at 4-, 6-, and 8-week intervals.

My observations came from my Welch Allyn ophthalmoscope and my panoptic ophthalmoscopes. The other observations came from the clients. The majority said their dog was more active, could retrieve or catch a ball or other toy better, and seemed overall more happy as an active family member. I perceived the lens to clear to various improved levels grossly.

I do not believe this consistent result to be from a "snake oil" but a legitimate prescription improving the life for several of my patients. It is not going to work for every one, not a question, but it can certainly improve many of my client's pet dogs without surgery to a more acceptable level of family activity.

Most pets and owners were happy with the results and understand that this is not at the same level as a surgical cataract or lens replacement but a viable alternative. That was the bottom line. Please call or feel free to chat further. I will try to respond more quickly.
